Course Overview

This seminar is in preparation of your commencement from higher education out into the world. We will deal with the business aspects of the arts, the creative side of the arts, the technological side of the arts and the reality of your possible future in the arts. The attached class-by-class schedule will give you a more detailed description of each class plus the various assignments throughout the semester.

The three major projects for the semester are 1) a mock interview for a position in higher education, 2) the creation of a personal web site that promotes you as an artist, and 3) a Business Operation Plan (BOP) demonstrating your research into future business/career options. There will be a variety of supporting activities during the course of the semester.

Grading Policy

You will be graded on all assigned projects, presentations and class participation.

Your regular attendance is strongly encouraged. *There are no make-ups for work missed when you are not in class*. After three absences, an Absence/Failing Report will be filed electronically with your Dean's Office. Starting with the fourth absence, your final grade will be lowered one letter with each absence (taking note of plus-minus grading - an "A" would become a "B"; a "B+" would become a "C+" and etc.).
