#### **Course Overview**

This course is the first of a four-semester sequence of group piano. It provides an introduction of keyboard skills and musicianship designed to acquire necessary functional skills (i.e. introduction to basic technique, keyboard theory, treble and bass clef reading, harmonization, transposition, improvisation, composition) and the study of repertoire, both solo and ensemble.

## **Grading Policy**

You will be graded frequently on assigned performances, compositions, pop quizzes as well as a midsemester and final jury (these will be individual). **As stated in the College of Fine Arts Bulletin**, you must complete the semester with a grade of C or better to be allowed to register for the next course level.

All grades you receive will be of equal weight in computing your final average. The individual jury exams will include several grades, at least one for each skill area. These will be treated as any other individual grades you have received throughout the semester. You will receive the requirements for individual juries as well as grading rubrics one to two weeks prior to the jury.
