Course Overview

This course is the fourth of a four-semester sequence of group piano. It provides a continuation of keyboard skills and musicianship designed to acquire necessary functional skills (i.e. technique, keyboard theory, sight reading, score reading, harmonization, transposition, improvisation, composition) and the study of repertoire, both solo and ensemble.

Grading Policy

You will be graded on a series of three proficiency examinations given throughout the semester. EACH CATEGORY OF EACH PROFICIENCY EXAM must be passed with a grade of **C** or better before you are allowed to proceed to the next exam. (Your original grade will be retained to be averaged together with all retake grades.) Composition assignments in Chapters 12, 13, 14 may be used for extra credit grades this semester.

If you have not satisfied all categories at the scheduled time of the next exam, you will receive an **F** for each category of that scheduled exam. Each category of the third proficiency must also be passed with a grade of **C** or better in order to successfully complete the 210K requirements. A grade of **X** will be given for the semester if all categories are not successfully completed at the Final Examination Period retakes. This incomplete will be removed at the time of successful completion of all categories. University policy dictates that this completion must occur no later than the end of the following long-term semester. Incompletes convert automatically to a grade of **F** if this deadline is not met. This is University policy!

Retakes of the last proficiency occur during the scheduled Final Examination Period and then again the Friday prior to the next long semester as well as during mid-semester and final jury times of the following long semester. The sign-up sheet will be posted two weeks prior to the scheduled retake time. An email reminder will be sent about retakes.
